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Programme Brief

Diploma in Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL) was established in June 2010 with a purpose of teaching English language to students at elementary level. Graduates are eligible to teach English in private primary schools or continue their studies to Degree level.

The programme has received full accreditation from MQA and is designed to produce graduates who will demonstrate a set of learning outcomes that possess advanced linguistic competence; operate as an effective and efficient TESL practitioner; possess and demonstrate the qualities of having high market values that suit the demands of the industry; as well as operate and be responsive socially and professionally.

This programme consists of various structures and covers different aspects such as: *Education Foundation* (i.e. Listening and Speaking Development, Reading and Writing Development, English Grammar Development), *Discipline Core* (i.e. Psychology in Education, Principles and Practices in Language Teaching, Teaching English Grammar, The Teaching of Listening and Speaking Skills, The Teaching of Reading and Writing Skills), *HEP Compulsory Course* (i.e. Study Skills, Pengajian Islam/ Pembangunan Pemuda, Pengajian Malaysia, Khidmat Masyarakat/ Pengurusan Masjid), *Electives* (i.e. Third Language), and *Professional Teaching Training* (i.e. Teaching Practice).

Besides acquiring the theoretical knowledge and skills of classroom learning from the areas specifically to the educational field, students experience the actual teaching environment via Teaching Practice at public or private primary schools in which they are evaluated through a series of observations. This helps graduates to enhance their teaching skills.

At the end of the programme, graduates should cultivate their potential that can be contributed to national development. They are expected to meet the need for English language teachers who are knowledgeable and skilful to comply with the standard of education in Malaysia.

- iv. Pass in SKM level 3 in a related field:
OR
- v. A certificate or its equivalent in a related field.

7. **Programme Description:**

This is a homegrown programme which is designed and conducted by KPTM with an advisory panel of experts from public and private higher education provider and industrial experts with the main objective of producing English language educators. The students will be involved in a variety of learning environments and instructional delivery methods. Throughout the programme, students will participate in lectures, demonstrations, peer teaching, group teaching and individual teaching practice.

Course Information

YEAR 1 (SEMESTER 1)

HPC1013 LISTENING AND SPEAKING DEVELOPMENT 1

Prerequisite: None

This course is designed to provide the students with practice in oral communication and listening skills for an academic environment. As part of the course, students will listen to materials from a variety of sources such as lectures, dialogues and news report. Students will be provided along with opportunities of presentation, participating in group discussions and the techniques to maximize listening and speaking skills.

HPC1023 ENGLISH GRAMMAR 1

Prerequisite: None

This course is designed to strengthen and enhance competency in English Grammar. They will learn Parts of Speech, Questions Formation and Subject-Verb Agreement. This is a prerequisite course for English Grammar 2.

HPC1033 READING DEVELOPMENT 1

Prerequisite: None

This course is designed to enhance students' ability in their reading skills in the English language. It focuses on the major aspects of reading skills including previewing, scanning, skimming and others. They also are taught in using vocabulary knowledge for effective reading, making inferens and conclusion.

HPC1043 WRITTING DEVELOPMENT 1

Prerequisite: None

This course is designed to improve students' ability in their writing skills in the English language. It focuses on the major aspects of writing skills including summarizing, paraphrasing, composing and giving personal response.

MPU2183 PENGHAYATAN ETIKA DAN PERADABAN

Prerequisite: None

Kursus ini mempersiapkan pelajar untuk menghayati etika dan peradaban yang wujud dalam masyarakat kepelbagaian etnik di Malaysia untuk memperteguhkan pemikiran kritikal dan analitikal mereka bagi menangani kehidupan yang lebih mencabar. Pengisian kursus ini memfokuskan kepada penghayatan etika dan peradaban dalam acuan Malaysia. Pelajar akan didedahkan dengan dinamika konsep etika dan peradaban yang menjadi kekuatan kepada pembentukan negara Malaysia berdasarkan susur masa evolusi sejarahnya dari era pra-kolonial sehingga ke pasca-kolonial. Kefahaman tentang pembentukan etika dan peradaban dalam masyarakat kepelbagaian dibincangkan bagi meningkatkan penghayatan etika dan peradaban ke arah pemantapan kesepaduan nasional dan bangsa Malaysia. Peradaban acuan Malaysia perlu dikupas serta diperdebatkan dalam aktiviti akademik berpandukan Perlembagaan Persekutuan sebagai tapak integrasi dan wahana etika dan peradaban. Pembinaan kesepaduan

nasional amat dipengaruhi oleh globalisasi dan perkembangan teknologi maklumat dan komunikasi yang kompleks. Oleh kerana itu, penghayatan etika dan peradaban menzahirkan perilaku tanggungjawab sosial dan digerakkan pada peringkat individu, keluarga, komuniti, masyarakat, dan negara. Justeru, perubahan yang berlaku dalam masyarakat dan pembangunan langsung ekonomi telah membawa cabaran baru dalam mengukuhkan kelestarian etika dan peradaban di Malaysia. Amalan Pendidikan Berimpak Tinggi (HIEPs) dipraktikkan dalam pengajaran dan pembelajaran bagi mendalami kursus ini. (pengajaran & pembelajaran).

MPU2133 BAHASA MELAYU KOMUNIKASI 1

Prerequisite: None

Kursus ini melatih pelajar antarabangsa untuk berkomunikasi dalam Bahasa melayu asas yang meliputi situasi kehidupan harian. Pelajar akan diperkenalkan dengan peraturan dan penulisan Bahasa melayu mudah. Pengajaran dan pembelajaran akan dilaksanakan dalam bentuk kuliah, tutorial, tugas dan pengalaman pembelajaran pelajar di dalam dan di luar kelas. Pada akhir kursus ini, pelajar diharap dapat berkomunikasi dan menulis karangan dengan menggunakan ayat mudah dengan berkesan.

HFA1013 BAHASA ARAB ASAS

Prerequisite: None

Kursus ini akan mendedahkan kepada pelajar perkara-perkara asas dalam bahasa Arab seperti huruf-huruf hijaiyyah, tatabahasa dan empat kemahiran bahasa (mendengar, membaca, menulis dan bertutur). Kursus ini juga melatih pelajar melengkap dan membina ayat-ayat mudah dan dialog-dialog ringkas dalam Bahasa Arab berdasarkan situasi tertentu.

HFM1023 INTRODUCTION TO MANDARIN

Prerequisite: None

This course covers information to the Chinese universal pronunciation system (Hanyu Pinyin), Chinese simplified characters, basic speaking, listening, writing and reading skills for communicate purposes on selected topics in daily life.

HFF1023 BEGINNER FRENCH

Prerequisite: None

This course is designed to focuses on exposure to, and practice of, general language functions in spoken, written and aural forms. Grammatical structures necessary for the production of the target language and practice of pronunciation, intonation and stress. It helps to develop language-learning skills and to foster cultural (Francophone) awareness.

YEAR 1 (SEMESTER 2)

HPC2013 LISTENING AND SPEAKING DEVELOPMENT 2

Prerequisite: HPC1013

This course is designed to improve students' listening and skills in English. It is a second level course intended to develop students' listening and speaking skills. This is a continuation of the previous subject which is Listening and Speaking Development 1. This course enhances student's confidence through speech presentation, group discussion and role play. It focuses mainly on effective listening skills and the production of correct English pronunciation.

HPC2023 ENGLISH GRAMMMAR 2

Prerequisite: HPC1023

This course is designed to enhance students' basic English grammar skills. It focuses on the different components in English Grammar such as tenses, modal auxiliaries, passive, clauses, gerunds and infinitives, and conditionals. Students must successfully complete English Grammar 1, prior to enrolling in English Grammar 2.

HPC2033 READING DEVELOPMENT 2

Prerequisite: HPC1033

This course is designed to improve students' knowledge on reading skills. Students are introduced to more complex reading materials and tasks to help enhance their understanding in and skills through reading different genres. They also will be exposed to the content structure of academic text, figurative and literal language and book reviewing skills.

HPC2043 WRITTING DEVELOPMENT 2

Prerequisite: HPC1043

This course is designed to improve students' knowledge on writing skills. Students are introduced to more complex reading and writing materials and tasks to enhance their writing skills as well. Exposure on citation skills to avoid plagiarism is also taught.

YEAR 1 (SEMESTER 3)

HED2013 PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICES IN LANGUAGE TEACHING

Prerequisite: NONE

This course is designed to focus on language teaching methodologies, approaches and principles for ESL. This course also provides students with a basic understanding of language acquisition, classroom management and basic practices for ESL teaching.

HED3153 HISTORY AND PHILOSOPHY OF EDUCATION

Prerequisite: NONE

This course introduces students to the historical and philosophical factors which influence education. In addition, this course also allows students to draw out the educational implications of these philosophies by placing them in the context of education, schooling, curriculum, and instruction.

HET3073 TEACHING ENGLISH GRAMMAR

Prerequisite: NONE

This course is designed to focus on language teaching methodologies, approaches and principles for ESL. This course also provides students with a basic understanding of language acquisition, classroom management and basic practices for ESL teaching.

MPU2223 STUDY SKILLS

Prerequisite: None

Study Skills is designed to help students improve their study skills and develop their ability to use it. This subject is also geared to provide the students with the awareness on the knowledge and tools that the students need in order to build the skills for lifelong learning. In addition, it will guide the students in understanding what they can do to be more efficient and effective learner. The learning strategies taught in this course are meant to be used for learning tasks in class, work and in their personal lives.

MPU2213 BAHASA KEBANGSAAN A

Prerequisite: None

Kursus ini menawarkan kemahiran berbahasa dari aspek mendengar, bertutur, membaca dan menulis sesuai dengan tahap intelek pelajar. Tujuan kursus ini adalah untuk meningkatkan kecekapan berbahasa dalam konteks rasmi dan tidak rasmi. Pengajaran dan pembelajaran akan dilaksanakan dalam bentuk kuliah, perbincangan, tugasan, aktiviti kebahasaan, lakonan, ujian dan peperiksaan. Pada akhir kursus ini, pelajar diharapkan dapat menguasai kemahiran berbahasa secara lisan dan tulisan.

MPU2353 INTEGRITI DAN ANTIRASUAH

Prerequisite: NONE

Kursus ini merangkumi konsep asas rasuah termasuk nilai integriti, antirasuah, bentuk perlakuan rasuah, salah guna kuasa dalam aktiviti seharian dan organisasi serta kaedah pencegahan rasuah. Kes berkaitan rasuah juga dibincangkan. Kaedah pengajaran dan pembelajaran dilaksanakan dalam bentuk 'pembelajaran berdasarkan pengalaman' melalui aktiviti individu dan kumpulan. Pada akhir kursus ini, pelajar dapat memahami amalan integriti, konsep rasuah, antirasuah dan salah guna kuasa serta pencegahan rasuah dalam masyarakat dan organisasi.

YEAR 2 (SEMESTER 1)

HSL1083 INTRODUCTION OF SOCIOLINGUISTICS

Prerequisite: NONE

This course is designed to introduce sociolinguistics and show how trends and developments in language are often related to the developments in society. The main basis for any conclusions as to the nature of the relationship between language and society will be provided by an examination of linguistic variation. After a general introduction to the field of sociolinguistics and a discussion of different approaches to the study of language in society, students will consider the effect of social factors, such as socio-economics class, gender and situation, on language use.

HSL1093 INTRODUCTION TO LANGUAGE ARTS

Prerequisite: NONE

This course is designed to introduce and develop the ability to analyse and interpret literary works using literary elements of fictions, poetry and play. By focusing on short story, novel, poetry and drama, students will learn on ways to analysing the literary devices, comprehending the themes and its underlying messages by applying the elements of prose and poetry. They will also develop the skills of expressing the texts through acting and poem.

HET3113 THE TEACHING OF READING AND WRITING SKILLS

Prerequisite: HPC2033

This course is designed to develop an understanding of theoretical concepts, strategies and classroom implementation to effectively teach reading and writing skills within the ESL primary school context.

HET3083 THE TEACHING OF LISTENING AND SPEAKING SKILLS

Prerequisite: HPC2013

This course is essential for students to understand several approaches and techniques of teaching listening and speaking skills. It also provides platform for students to gain practical experience in the field.

HED3103 SOCIOLOGY OF EDUCATION

Prerequisite: NONE

This course is designed to introduce the students to sociological theories of education, identify the major concepts and main features of their applications, and evaluate critical issues related to the fields of study. The students also will be equipped with a basic understanding of how the education system functions in society. Through assigned tasks, students are expected to develop skills to critically evaluate and analyse their social realities through the lense of different theoretical frameworks.

MPU2412 KHIDMAT MASYARAKAT 1

Prerequisite: MPU2243

Modul ini memberi peluang kepada pelajar untuk memahami kursus khidmat masyarakat berdasarkan pengalaman praktikal bersama masyarakat setempat dengan melibatkan bersama agensi sukarelawan. Di akhir kursus ini pelajar memperolehi kecekapan dalam mengurus sesuatu program kemasyarakatan melalui kemahiran insaniah seperti menyelesaikan masalah dan kerjasama dalam kumpulan.

MPU2422 PENGURUSAN MASJID
Prerequisite: MPU2243

Kursus ini memberi peluang kepada pelajar memahami secara mendalam peranan dan fungsi institusi masjid di samping memberi pendedahan kepada pelajar tentang peranan dan etika kerjaya pentadbiran institusi tersebut melalui aktiviti yang dijalankan.

YEAR 2
(SEMESTER 2)

HED3113 EDUCATION IN MALAYSIA
Prerequisite: NONE

This course is designed to equip students with Malaysia's educational landscape that evolved from a fragmentary system inherited from the British colonial administrators until now. This subject will focus on the description of the Malaysian educational system as seen through the policies, laws, and regulations that have contributed to the development of the system.

HSL3093 DRAMA PRODUCTION
Prerequisite: NONE

This course is designed to introduce students to drama and its elements. Students will then be exposed to the techniques in drama training as well as script writing which then will be employed through drama performance. It also increase students' confidence, fluency, and the linguistic ability. It provides a non-conventional context for authentic and effective language practice. In the process, it will increase their confidence in using the language, the use of integrated skills in reading and writing script, and presenting the play will also increase their overall language competency.

HED3123 CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTIONS
Prerequisite: NONE

This course is designed to provide students with an extensive understanding of curriculum development and instruction field through discussions of the philosophy, theories as well as models of curriculum and instruction in Malaysia and other countries. Students will also be exposed to the current issues related to curriculum and instruction field.

YEAR 2
(SEMESTER 3)

PEN2303 DIGITAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP
Prerequisite: None

This course examines the theory and practice of promoting online technologies in start-ups and existing firms. It explores successful frameworks, strategies, funding techniques, business models, risks, and barriers for introducing break-through products and services. Students will develop business folio for articulating, evaluating, refining, and pitching a

new product or service offering, either as a start-up business plan or a new initiative at an existing firm.

HET3093 LANGUAGE TESTS IN SCHOOL

Prerequisite: NONE

This course is designed to provide students with the relevant knowledge in constructing a reliable and valid test to assess language learning. Students are also required to construct language test items and present them as part of the course evaluation. At the end of the course, students will produce a complete test paper.

HET3103 LANGUAGE PROGRAMME PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Prerequisite: NONE

This course is designed to provide students with the ability to design and manage a language development programme. Students will conduct a simple research in order to identify factors that most likely to influence a language development programme. Emphasis is placed on the proposal writing, presentation, brochures, management of event and report writing.

HED3133 PSYCHOLOGY IN EDUCATION

Prerequisite: NONE

This course is designed to introduce the concepts, theories, and research in educational psychology. The topics covered include cognitive development during the school years, learning theories, instructional approaches, motivation and individual differences.

YEAR 3 (SEMESTER 1)

HED3147 TEACHING PRACTICE

Prerequisite: PASSED ALL COURSES

This course is designed to expose the final semester students to undergo 14 weeks of practicum in schools/relevant education institutions. They are required to be the teacher's assistant in English subject at any level found appropriate by the school and the syllabus that they are attached to. Each practicum teacher will be assigned to a supervising lecturer from the college, a supervising teacher from the school (school mentor) and a school's co-curricular/sports activities advisor. The focus of this tenure is on the development of teaching experience for the practicum teachers. With this teaching practice and learning activity, they will gain confidence in teaching, enable them to put theory into practice as well as make adaptations in preparation of joining the teaching profession.
